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CMAS Testing Information April 4th, 6th & 7th

Why do these scores matter?

- CMAS and MAP scores are used as a data point for placement into high school programs such as advanced classes, remedial courses, as well entry into tech programs (Future Forward and Bollman)
- The state uses CMAS scores to rate schools and for funding purposes.

How can families support their student(s) in CMAS and MAP scores and their education in general?

- Encourage students to complete all assignments and learning activities in all their classes, especially making sure that students make up all assessment opportunities.
- Be involved in the student's academics. Ask questions about what students are learning and ask to see work sent home. Log into Infinite Campus and ask about scores.
- Remind students of your expectations for their learning and to follow school expectations so that all students are able to learn and grow.
- Reach out to teachers and the school with any questions around your student's education. We are all here to partner to support students in learning and growing.
- Remind students to bring a charged chromebook to school EVERY DAY.
- Reading at home makes a BIG difference in students' learning!

Day of Testing


- Encourage your student to have a goodnight sleep the night before.
- Encourage your student to have breakfast on the days of testing, whether it is at home, or getting free breakfast in the TMS cafeteria!
- Remind students to bring their charged chromebook AND charger the days of testing.
- Encourage your student to do the best they can that day and to be mindful of the other students taking the test so that they can also do the best they can. TRY on every question. We want to know what you know of the standards. It's okay if you are unsure, the best thing you can do in any situation is try.

Teachers are teaching and assessing the standards set out by the state of Colorado in classes daily. These are the standards that are assessed on CMAS.

What supports are in place at TMS to support students with CMAS?

Students take fall, winter, and spring MAP in reading and Math. These tests support students in experiencing a testing environment. This also provides standardized data to teachers to help support student learning.

Student Drop-Off




Thank you for your help on this request!

Chromebook Policies

If a Chromebook is turned in by a custodian:

1st time-Warning 2nd time-Lunch Detention 3rd time-Call home and after school tutorials/ detention

If a Chromebook is lost:

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Students should report it to the media tech in the library to have the device disabled/ locked.

Student will then be notified to come retrieve their device when found.

If damages are assessed they will be determined as intentional or non-intentional:

Fines escalate by incident. The first incident will be documented and fined for \$5 until the damage intent is determined.

Fines will be removed if determined to be non-intentional. Non-intentional damage includes software issues and normal usage wear and tear.

Any physical damage outside of normal wear and tear will be classified as intentional. 1st Incident -\$5 2nd Incident -\$50 3rd Incident -\$75 4th Incident or lost -\$150



- For direct deposit of refund or automatic withdrawal if you owe, bring proof of account (Check)
- Birth dates for you, spouse, and dependents
- Information for all deductions/credits
- Total paid to day care provider and their tax ID number

District Weather Policy

Process for School Closures and 1-hour Delayed Starts:

In the event of inclement weather, Adams 12 Five Star Schools uses a variety of resources to determine if conditions exist that warrant a 1-hour delayed start or closure of schools.

If conditions pose a concern for student and staff safety, the district will make every effort to announce a decision by 5:30 a.m. to close or delay opening schools. A 1-hour delayed start or closure will be communicated in several different ways, including:

- District website
- School websites
- Local media outlets
- Email and text message to parents
 - Ensure your information is up-to-date in Infinite Campus
 - In order to receive text messages, opt-in today by texting "YES" to 67587
- District's hotline (720) 972-4000
- Social media (Facebook Twitter)

Keep in mind, you will only receive alerts if schools are closed or operating on a 1-hour delay. If schools are open and operating on a normal schedule you will not receive an alert.

If schools are open but a parent feels, based on personal circumstances, that conditions pose a safety concern for their child getting to or from school they can call the school for an excused absence.

State Launches Historic I Matter Program

The Office of Behavioral Health has launched **IMatter**, a program to provide up to three free counseling sessions for Colorado youth, as a part of House Bill 21-1258(more information below). Parents can sign up and get resources and therapy sessions for their child. Youth, ages 12-18, can sign up for mental health sessions. The Colorado Office of Behavioral Health and its partners have launched IMatter, a program that provides up to three free counseling sessions for Colorado youth.

Get Connected

Youth and their parents can visit the I Matter platform to take a confidential online survey about their mental health and schedule sessions with a licensed behavioral health clinician, primarily online over telehealth. All Colorado youth ages 18 or younger—or 21 and younger if receiving special education services—are eligible to receive free services.
